"STC's yearly event is a great way for all GTA residents to learn about Chinese culture *and* be entertained."

Chinese custom encourages guests to wear red clothing, symbolizing fire and good luck, to a Chinese New Year celebration. So, from 12 noon until 6 pm, visitors and shoppers can enjoy a free photo taken, printed and emailed with a Chinese New Year character (while quantities last). 
